The buzzing of scouts in Hedeland Naturpark

Yesterday, more than 32,000 guides, scouts and volunteers moved into Hedeland Naturpark.

After more than five hours of transport a scout group from Svenstrup near Aalborg finally reached the campsite, delayed by a queue on the Storebælt bridge.

The queue had an impact on the arrival plans. In the cour-

se of a few hours 360 busses full of scouts and guides in the tens of thousands arrived at the jamboree.

In total 791 groups will attend Jamboree Denmark 2022, most of which arrived yesterday.

Some arrived by bus, like the group from Svenstrup, while others arrived on foot or on bicycles. Stenlænderne group is one of those groups.

They have spent the past two days walking from Stenløse to the campsite.
