## From the Mohammed cartoon crisis to scouting partnership

**The partnership between Tunisian scouts and the Danish KFUM scouts creates cultural understanding. The partnership has also had the effect that the number of active Tunisian scouts has jumped from 25,000 at the beginning of the project to almost 55,000 today.**

"It has been life changing for many Tunisian scouts that through the partnership "Future leaders" they have been able to focus on community citizenship, freedom of speech, democracy and inclusion of youths," Wahid Labidi says.

He is head of the board of representatives for the Tunisian scouts, Les Scouts Tunisiens.

Wahid Labidi is participating in Jamboree Denmark 2022 with 25 other Tunisian scouts. He has worked with the partnership "future leaders" since 2007.

In connection with the part-

nership, which is partly financed by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Denmark, Tunisian scouts are being educated.

They are being educated in social entrepreneurship, democratic development and advocacy.

They also create events with focus on community citizenship, dialog and inclusion of youths.

### **Making a difference**

"We wanted to create something that would really make a difference in the cultural understanding between Tunisia

and Denmark. At the beginning of the project in 2007 in the light of the Mohammed cartoon crisis it was quite the challenge", says international development consultant for the KFUM-Scouts Peter Lentz and continues:

"However, it has been a great success and we have really seen a shift in the mindset of the participants. They have gotten a great understanding for each other's cultures and through dialogue have built up confidence in the ability to cooperate in scouting despite cultural differences."

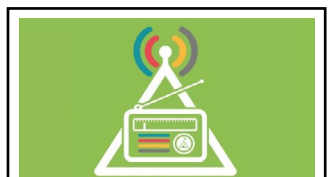
