The vision and theme of Jamboree Denmark 2026

When we bring together 30,000 guides and scouts, along with volunteers, for Jamboree Denmark 2026, we do more than just sleep in tents and cook over an open fire – though, of course, that's an essential part of the experience. We're aiming for more. We wish to create a week where everyone feels involved, heard, and is an integral part of a greater community.

This is all under the jamboree's theme:
Connect and include.

What does this entail? Community is a constant and key component in all guiding and scouting activities, naturally including our time at Jamboree Denmark. It's about bringing people together across ages, nationality or scout and guide organisations and experiences. It's about being curious about one another, taking responsibility for our shared community, gaining fresh perspectives, and making room for both grand community gatherings and small personal moments. This might be when you're gathered around the campfire with a neighbouring patrol, roasting marshmallows, learning to greet new friends in five new languages, or assisting someone with digging trenches in the rain.

Jamboree Logo

In the jamboree logo, we've included the iconic Jamboree Denmark tent and flag design, linking back to previous jamborees and showcasing Jamboree Denmark 2026 as part of the ongoing community from past gatherings. Simultaneously, we've included the location – Hedeland Nature Park – within the logo.

Moreover, we have brought camp elements into the logo by providing space for

- Trees and hills, symbolising Hedeland Nature Park
- Tents, campfires, sun, and rainbows, representing camp life and the variable danish summer weather with rain and sun
- Four guides and scouts symbolising the community within the scout movement, each representing their own subcamp

The logo also becomes the jamboree badge, which is distributed to all participants.



A sustainable jamboree

Together, we will create a more sustainable jamboree.

When we gather 30,000 participants for Jamboree Denmark 2026, it will have an impact on our carbon footprint. Therefore, the jamboree aims to take responsibility for reducing the consumption of the planet's resources.

Jamboree Denmark leaves a significant imprint. Both participants and guests depart with experiences, friendships, and knowledge gained. However, the jamboree also leaves its imprint on the planet.

Transporting 30,000 people domestically and internationally is costly, and building a temporary town the size of midsize danish town requires substantial resources. That's why the jamboree organisation has identified five focus areas where, together, we can make an extra effort to reduce our environmental footprint.

The five focus areas are:

- Jamboree food: greener, more organic, and locally sourced ingredients
- Transport: online meetings, car sharing, and group transportation
- Energy consumption: reducing power use wherever possible
- Materials: increased recycling/renting of equipment, waste sorting
- Volunteers' work environment: double staffing, aligning expectations, and fostering fellowship throughout the organisation

In the information packages, we will explore each focus area in detail. We'll begin with the food.



A sustainable jamboree

Jamboree food

The food will be greener, more organic, and more locally sourced. This means the meals at Jamboree Denmark 2026 will be based on the Danish Veterinary and Food Administration's dietary guidelines for a plant-rich and varied diet. In this way, the jamboree reduces the climate impact of our meals. For example, evening meals will be vegetarian. Breakfasts and lunches will be familiar from previous jamborees.

Dedicated food-loving volunteers are working diligently to prepare the jamboree's cookbook. Danish groups nationwide are testing and evaluating recipes, techniques, and flavours to ensure the first draft of the cookbook is ready for summer camps in 2025.

We already know, however, that the cookbook:

- Will emphasise familiar and satisfying vegetarian dishes.
- As much as possible, it will use seasonal vegetables and danish ingredients.
- Will include straightforward and easy-to-follow recipes for everyone to participate in cooking

The cookbook will offer two options for dinners each day, from which groups can select when registering. The last day of the jamboree is an exception, with only one dish, which will be prepared for lunch. Further information about this will be provided later in the year. Additionally, the cookbook contains suggestions for lunch meals.

The final version of the cookbook is expected to be released in early 2026.

Mac and cheese with summer vegetables Recipe for 10 people

Ingredients

- 3 bags of sugar snap peas
- 2 heads of cauliflower
- 3 tablespoons of oil for frying
- 1 kg penne pasta
- 2.5 l of water
- 3 vegetable bouillon cubes
- 7.5 dl of single cream (15%)
- 450 g grated cheddar
- 2.5 teaspoons mustard
- 3 cloves of garlic
- 1.5 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1 tsp. salt and pepper

Equipment

- 2 large bowls
- 1 large pot
- 2 cutting boards
- 2 knives
- 1 stirring spoon
- 1 tablespoon
- 1 teaspoon

Rinse and chop the sugar snap peas and cauliflower into bite-sized pieces. Peel and finely chop the garlic.

Heat a little bit of oil in a large pot. Sauté the garlic, sugar snap peas, and cauliflower for a few minutes, keeping the vegetables crisp. Then transfer to a bowl.

Place the pasta, water, and vegetable bouillon cubes into the same pot and bring to a boil. Ensure the fire isn't too hot; the water should only just reach the boiling point. Once the water has evaporated and the pasta is al dente (add 5 dl of water if it evaporates too quickly), add mustard, grated nutmeg, cream, cheddar cheese, and the vegetables from the bowl into the pot with the cooked pasta. Let the dish simmer for a few minutes, stirring thoroughly. Watch the heat carefully to prevent the cheese from burning.

Season with salt and pepper and possibly more mustard.

If desired, cut some raw vegetables sticks or prepare a salad as a side dish.

Participation fee

How much does it cost to attend the jamboree?

The jamboree executive committee has worked diligently to establish an appropriate price and pricing structure for the upcoming jamboree. We have set two different prices to encourage scouts and guides to register as early as possible for the jamboree. Early registration is crucial for the jamboree organisation, simplifying the planning of purchases, activities, and infrastructure for participants.

If you register between October 2025 and February 2026, the participation fee is DKK 2,475.

If you register for Jamboree Denmark 2026 between March and June 2026, the fee to participate will be DKK 2,600.

Additionally, volunteers contributing more than 40 hours before, during, or after the jamboree can get a 30% discount, paying DKK 1,730.

How much does it cost to attend half of the jamboree?

There is an option to attend the jamboree for a shorter period and receive a reduction in the prices mentioned above. A day at the jamboree consists of dinner, breakfast, and lunch.

Participation fee

What does the price cover?

The participant fee is the jamboree's largest source of income and must cover all activities, events, participant transport to and from the jamboree, essential infrastructure such as toilets and water supply, food for participants, emergency services, as well as the costs of setting up and dismantling the jamboree.

We strongly recommend that everyone uses the offered shared transportation. For our international participants we offer shared transportation from specific points of entry, such as Danish airports and border ferry ports. The details regarding prices and ordering of, among other things, spars and firewood, as well as the decision on reimbursement rates for transport, will be announced later in 2025


How do we pay?

Some registration details are still being finalised. However, the jamboree executive committee has prioritised announcing the pricing early to assist groups in planning their summer activities. Further payment details will be included in the upcoming information package, distributed before registration opens in October.

Campsite rental

Many municipalities offer subsidies for campsite rental, which at Jamboree Denmark covers the costs of establishing the campsite and infrastructure. Once we have an informed estimate, it will be published on the website. The actual amount will only be announced when the jamboree's accounts are finalised in autumn 2026.

WHAT DOES THE PARTICIPANT FEE COVER?



International participants

This year's theme, 'Connect and include', goes beyond Denmark and reaches for the international world we are part of. We strive for a fellowship that transcends national boundaries and reaches beyond Jamboree Denmark at Hedeland Nature Park. Our focus is on making a positive impact on the communities we are involved in, at local, national and global levels. Guide and scout associations worldwide have already received invitations to Jamboree Denmark 2026, and we hope to welcome as many international guides and scouts as possible to Hedeland Nature Park next summer.

We are proud that Denmark will host the World Jamboree in 2031! Do you already have a friendship group eager to get a taste? Then quickly invite them to a fantastic experience at Jamboree Denmark 2026. If you haven't formed a connection with a friendship group yet, you can request one during registration, and we'll do our best to match you with one. In this way, you will help create unforgettable memories of meeting Denmark and Danish guides and scouts.

Subcamps

The Subcamps

Jamboree Denmark 2026 is divided into four subcamps, which will home both the scout groups and the camp volunteers. The scout groups are allocated within the subcamps by municipality, as has been the case in the previous three jamborees. We expect the municipal allocation to be finalised and published in Information package 3 at the beginning of 2026. In each subcamp, there will also be a section for the jamboree volunteers.

The four subcamps have been named Havet (the Sea), Byen (the City), Skoven (the Forest), and Landet (the Countryside), and below you can get a sense of the special experiences that await you in each subcamp.

Camp Life

At Jamboree Denmark 2026 we aim to invite everyone into the fellowship and create an environment where scouts can build memories and relationships beyond the activity periods. This is what we refer to as camp life.

Our logo provides a sense of familiarity and indicates the availability of facilities for use.



Cashless jamboree

Jamboree Denmark 2026 is expected to be cashless, following the lead of previous camps. This ensures safety and convenience for everyone. All participants will receive a jamboree wristband equipped with a chip for payments. This solution is what we call "Skejser".

Additionally, you will be able to use standard payment cards and, to a limited extent, MobilePay.

Information package 3 will include more information on handling the Skejser wristbands.
