The major features have now found their place in Hedeland and we have finalised overall the map for Jamboree Denmark 2026. This allows us to present the layout of the jamboree.

The jamboree has moved east

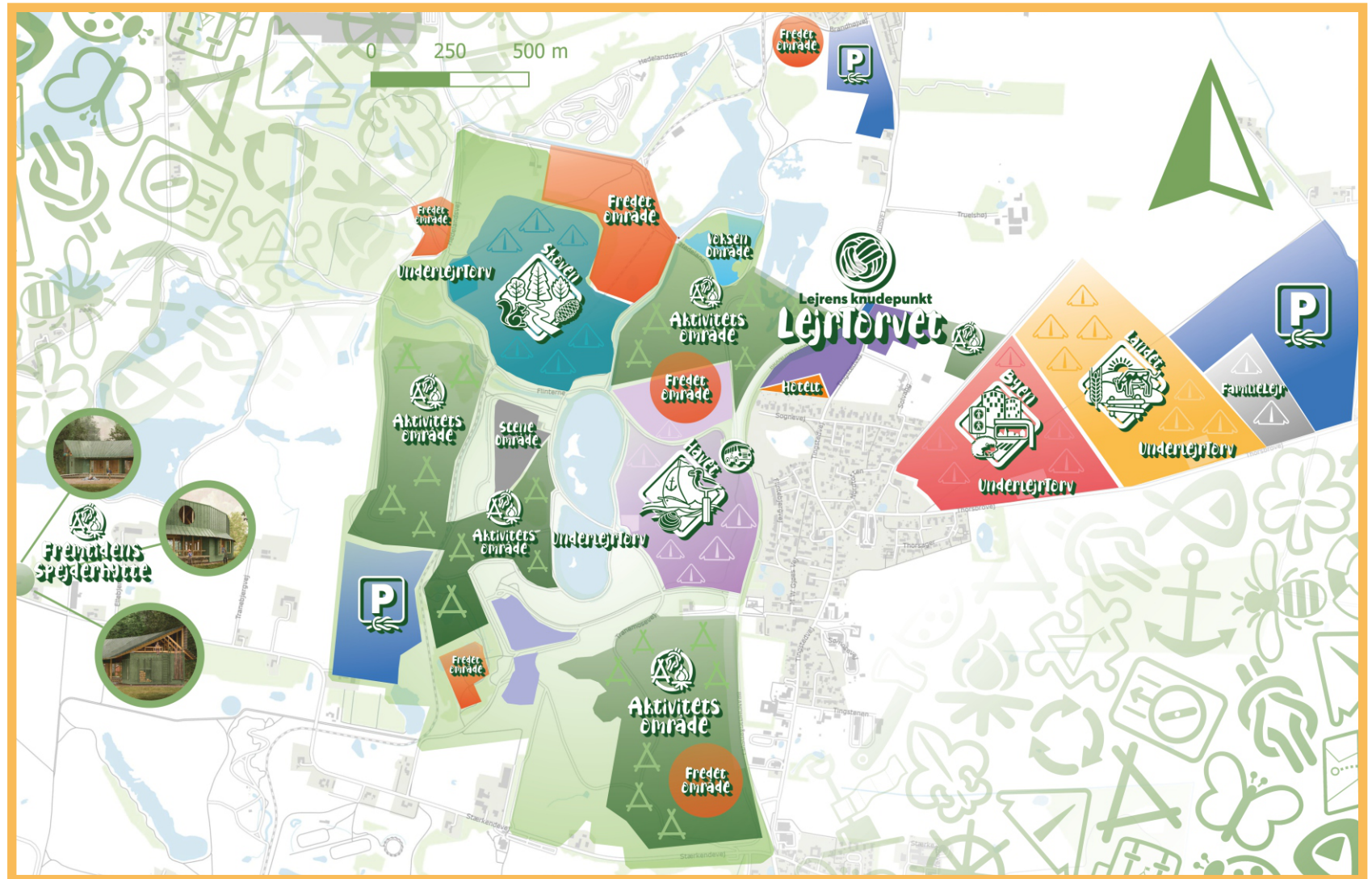
Although Jamboree Denmark 2026 is being hosted in the same location as Jamboree Denmark 2022, the physical setup will not replicate the previous jamboree. Besides being a lovely park, Hedeland Nature Park is also an active gravel pit. Since our last jamboree in 2022, the area where where Subcamp Greve was found in 2022 has been 'consumed', necessitating several elements to shift east. Consequently, Lejrtorvet (the jamboree main square with the supermarket, food trucks, etc.) has been moved north of the village of Reerslev, while two subcamp areas have been moved east of Lejrtorvet.

Skibakken (the ski slope) provides the backdrop for the shows on the main scene

Skibakken (the ski slope) will once again act as the magnificent setting for all the large shows at the Jamboree, with space for over 30,000 spectators, and with sloping side that ensures excellent viewing for all.

Registration and payment

The participant fee was announced in Information Package 1. Also, the registration will open soon. On the jamboree website (www.spejderneslejr.dk/en), you can find details on the registration process and how to get help with the registration. Below, you'll find updated information about participant fees, registration and payment.

Participant Fees

The participant fees already published apply to children aged 6 and above. Children aged 0-2 may participate for free, while those aged 3-5 pay a reduced participant fee, see the table below. Transport is not included in the participant fee for 0-5 year-olds, but it can be purchased during the registration. It is the participant's age at the start of the jamboree on 18 July 2026 that determines their age category. All participants must register via the jamboree's registration system, regardless of the participant fee.

Registration and payment

Registration

The registration opens in October 2025 and remains open until June 2026. There are various deadlines along the way to follow.

1 March 2026

- The registration is closed for new groups after this date.
- The participant fee will increase for all new participant registrations.
- A cancellation fee will apply for cancellations.
(The participant fee and registration are connected with the individual participant)
- Based on the number registered participants, campsite areas will be allocated to the groups. The allocation will be announced once finalised.

1 May 2026

- Cancellation fee increases for participant cancellations.

1 July 2026

- Registering more participants is not possible.
- Refunds will not be given for cancellations.

Payment

From 1 March, the first invoice for registered groups will be sent, including payment for any poles and purchased hardwood firewood. The next invoice will be sent at the beginning of May, covering changes made in March and April. A third invoice is issued in early July for changes made in May and June. A fourth invoice is issued just before the jamboree for changes made in July. Finally, after the jamboree a final adjustment will occur.

All invoices must be paid via a bank transfer in Danish kroner (DKK).

There is no option for payment in instalments.

Registration and payment

IST Registration

IST members can register at any time up until the jamboree starts. To qualify for a volunteer discount, you must have an approved role as an IST through the jamboree's job bank. When cancelling a registration after 1 March 2026, a volunteer must pay a cancellation fee equal to the ordinary participants.

Do you want to help make Jamboree Denmark 2026 an unforgettable experience and get a discount on your participant fee at the same time?

If you are at least 15 years old and spend at least 40 hours working as a jamboree volunteer/IST before, during, or after the jamboree, you will get 30% reduction to your participant fee. At the same time, you will learn new competencies and skills while joining our large volunteer community. We are seeking more volunteers in all parts of the Jamboree Planning Organisation. Help out in one of the jamboree canteens, join the jamboree's emergency services or help spread our message as part of the communication team.

Activities

You can look forward to many fantastic and exciting activities at Jamboree Denmark 2026. All these wonderful activities are possible because we gather thousands of scouts and guides from all over the world. Some activities will be shared by everyone, while others will be more flexible, allowing you to plan your own adventures.

Free Activities

At Jamboree Denmark, there are numerous exciting Free Activities – both those you can sign up for in advance and those you can join whenever you fancy.

The activities take place on the jamboree site in Hedeland Nature Park, and in the cities of Roskilde and Høje Taastrup. Moreover, the nearby Veddelev Harbour will host all the sailing activities, thus ensuring there's something for everyone!

Your guides and scouts can look forward to earning the Activity Badge. This is achieved by collecting badges from various activities. More information will follow.

Activity Registration system

After evaluating previous jamborees, we have decided to revamp the activity registration system, with the aim of making it fairer and more user-friendly.

Subcamp day

Subcamp Day is a day-long event where the participants from each subcamp participate together. Each day, a new subcamp will join the event.

On subcamp day, an inventor will solve all the guides and scouts' challenges. The twisted bread must be crafted with precision, all knots tied in under a second, and hikes conducted without a single blister.

The inventor is keen to build the perfect guide or scout robot. The only thing missing before the robot is complete is data and input from all the guides and scouts at the jamboree. Therefore, all guides and scouts at the jamboree are invited to contribute to the creation of "The Perfect Guide or Scout".

But does the perfect guide or scout truly exist?

...will the robot assist the guides and scouts?

...and what is the inventor's true intention?

Practical Information

Subcamp day will take place both in and around the subcamps. The day will be divided into age groups: 8-11 and 12-17 years and will take place during the morning and afternoon activity slots. You can either return to the jamboree for lunch or bring a packed meal.

Activities

Spejdermødet (a meeting of scouts and guides)

- Use your voice, shape your world.

Democracy isn't about ticking a box every four years. It's about listening, taking action and responsibility – and having the courage to use your voice. At Jamboree Denmark 2026, we invite all guides and scouts to do just that.

Spejdermødet is a vibrant and playful democratic public gathering for children and young people. It's a safe and curious space where guides and scouts can explore their beliefs, reflect on others' perspectives, and see how their voice can make an impact.

It's not about having the right answers. It's about having the bravery to be curious, ask questions, and reflect.

Traditional guide and scout activities are combined with engaging, thought-provoking experiences, making everyday democracy intuitive and unforgettable. All woven together by the Guide and Scout Promise, where children lead children, and everyone is given a place at the table.

Spejdermødet fosters dialogue through play

- Mini-events
- Creative workshops
- Open and respectful debates
- Young advocates express what many are thinking
- Storytelling and personal encounters

Discussion topics cover rights, responsibility, society, reflection, climate, well-being, fellowship, and diversity. Topics we know are significant to today's youth.

The area will also host nonprofit organisations addressing issues from vulnerable children and youth to taboo subjects and social challenges. They add to this with activities, dialogues, and inspiration that reach beyond the guide and scout life – broadening horizons for children and young people.

Practical Information

Throughout the week, you can visit Spejdermødet in its dedicated area, with a particular focus on Wednesday when it features more extensive activities.

Reflection and Spirituality

Reflection Time

Reflection Time is one of the two branches that form the jamboree's spiritual heart. Life during the jamboree can often be fast-paced. Reflection Time encourages you to take occasional breaks.

With the jamboree's motto as our guide, we invite scouts, guides, and leaders into a space where there's room for dialogue, reflection, and spiritual encounters.

Activities occur throughout the jamboree, with most being drop-in. We also plan to prepare materials that groups can take home to continue their reflection. Further information and details on registration will follow later.

Reflection Time conducts activities across five categories:

Devotion & Reflection

Throughout the week, opportunities for both devotions (with a religious basis) and reflections (with a general humanist focus) are offered, creating space for contemplation. These are typically brief sessions aiming to provide a short respite in your daily life. Drawing inspiration from "Scouts' Own", you delve into and explore the Guide and Scout Promise, particularly focusing on community aspects.

Pop-up

At any time and place in the jamboree, you might suddenly encounter an event prompting a moment of reflection. By pausing, you'll be able to return to the community with renewed strength.

Group Camp Activities

These activities include devotions, reflections, and other sessions you as a leader can organise within the your group's camp when your group has time and/or seeks a moment for reflection.

The Bedtime Story

This bedtime story is designed to be a comforting close to the day for scouts and guides while also offering food for thought for both the young and the adults.

The Hour of Reflection

Scheduled for a designated time, the Hour of Reflection invites the entire jamboree to step back from the flurry of activities and provides space to reflect, converse, and engage in spirituality. More information will follow in the next information package.

Transport

Transport to and from the Jamboree

All participants and volunteers are offered inland transport. We recommend that as many as possible take advantage of this offer. This maximises bus capacity and helps reduce the environmental impact. It also alleviates traffic pressure on peak arrival and departure days, easing logistics.

The transportation, primarily by bus, is included in the participation fee. For our international participants we offer transportation from designated points of entry, such as Danish airports and border ferry ports. Transport to the Jamboree is available from 18 to 22 July, and back between 22 and 26 July 2026.

Transportation offers the chance to extend the Jamboree experience with both new and old guide and scout friends when travelling together. Besides environmental and logistical benefits, transport positively impacts social sustainability.

If you arrive with your own bus to the jamboree site, you can get a small reduction in the participation fee.

Parking

Parking spaces for planning team, IST members and leaders will be available during the jamboree. Space is limited, so consider whether bringing a car is necessary.

Parking for trailers, buses, and trucks will also be provided. Further details will be available in an upcoming information package.

A paid parking area for visitors will be available close to the jamboree site.

POLES and FIREWOOD

Order

Included in the participant fee, you'll find softwood firewood in three-metre lengths available for free, which the group will need to saw and split themselves. During the jamboree, there will be designated areas where chainsaws may be used for two hours daily.

The group can purchase poles and split hardwood firewood for delivery to Jamboree Denmark. Orders are placed at the time of the group's registration. **The deadline for ordering poles and hardwood firewood is 1 March 2026.** After this date, you cannot alter your order.

Payment will be made via invoice in March 2026.

More information on the distribution of poles before the jamboree will be provided in the next information package in early 2026.

Poles and firewood post-jamboree

All poles and hardwood firewood ordered and paid through registration belong to the group and may be taken home after the jamboree. The deadline for collecting poles after the jamboree is 31 July 2026. Expenses related to this are the responsibility of each group.

Should the group decide not to take their poles home, they can be left at a storage facility by arrangement with the person responsible in the subcamp, and subsequently they will become property of Jamboree Denmark.

POLES and FIREWOOD

Wooden Pole Structures

Wooden pole structures under four metres in height, where no platform plans for occupancy above two metres (such as dining tables, entrance archways, tripods for hanging, etc.) can be erected without a permit.

However, the following wooden pole structures require approval from the authorities via Jamboree Denmark's emergency services before the jamboree.

- Wooden pole structures intending to hold people at over one metre in height, with planned overnight stays
- Wooden pole structures designed for occupancy at heights exceeding two metres
- Wooden pole structures exceeding four metres in height (excluding flagpoles and other single masts)

If you plan on constructing any of the above wooden pole structures, you must submit an application to Jamboree Denmark's emergency services at beredskab@sl2026.dk. The application must include a detailed description and a sketch of the structure.

The application deadline is 1 March 2026.



Jamboree Helpers and The Sunflower Camp

A disability is not necessarily a barrier to volunteering or staying at Jamboree Denmark as a guest.

At Jamboree Denmark the danish service team have the opportunity to volunteer as a jamboree helper if they are a young person or an adult with a disability, regardless of whether they are associated with a guide or scout group.

The opportunity to become a jamboree helper is primarily aimed at young people and adults with mild developmental or physical disabilities. As a jamboree helper, they'll participate in smaller tasks alongside the Jamboree's other danish service team. If substantial support is needed, one can still become a jamboree helper if accompanied by a support person. The danish service team can be a jamboree helper for a few days or for the entire jamboree.

The Sunflower Camp

The danish jamboree helpers who wish to stay on the Jamboree but are not with a guide or scout group can reside at our Sunflower Camp. The Sunflower Camp caters to jamboree helpers and others with specific needs. This is also where jamboree helpers can gather when not on duty in the larger jamboree.

The Sunflower Camp not only accommodates jamboree helpers but also offers facilities for guests seeking a disability-friendly environment as their base. However, you must be registered as a jamboree helper if you wish to stay overnight. For an overnight stay at the Sunflower Camp, it's essential to bring all personal necessities, including one's own tent, sleeping bag, sleeping mat, and eating utensils. We supply cooking camping gear and similar items.
