Registration

Registration for Jamboree Denmark 2026 is in full swing, with interest in the jamboree already running high. Until February 28th, you can register at an early bird price, where the cost for the entire jamboree is DKK 2,475. From March to June 2026, the price will increase to DKK 2,600 for the entire jamboree.

If your group or persons in it require a visa to enter Denmark, sign up should be before February 14th to ensure enough time to acquire the visa.

From March 1st, it will no longer be possible for new groups to register. It remains possible to register additional participants within a group. Please be aware that registration is tied to each individual participant. This means you cannot change a participant's name without a possible cancellation fee and change in price. The allocation of campsite areas is based on the number of registered participants in the group as of March 1st.

The deadline for food and wooden pole orders is also at the end of February. We encourage groups to keep an eye on deadlines in their planning. For example a 10 person dining table of poles requires 15 3 meter poles, and an additional 5 if it is an integrated dining table with a raised fire.

We are experiencing greater interest than previously from international guide and scout groups who are keen to visit and participate in Jamboree Denmark. This adds a new dimension to the jamboree, creating opportunities for exciting cross-cultural exchanges.

The process of pairing Danish and international friendship groups began in January. The allocation of friendship groups is based on those already registered for the jamboree. To get the best selection of friendship groups, it's advisable to register your group promptly.

We're eager for more groups to join in the coming weeks. We can barely wait to bring together guides and scouts from near and far at Jamboree Denmark 2026.



Payment at the Jamboree

At Jamboree Denmark 2026, you can pay using debit/credit cards (Visa, Mastercard, Discover, American Express), Apple Pay, Google Pay, and Skejser (via the chip on the wristband).

We encourage all adults who can, to use debit/credit cards, Apple Pay, or Google Pay for payments at the jamboree.

All participants are issued a wristband with a chip to be used for payments. This is known as Skejser. The Skejser solution is designed for the youngest participants at the jamboree to safeguard them against losing cash or theft.

The Skejser option will be available for registration and deposits from mid-May 2026 and throughout the jamboree. We suggest reviewing the upcoming guidelines and conditions before registering.

Who will be sent wristbands?

Mid-May 2026, wristbands, and other items will be dispatched to participants and volunteers registered before May 1st, 2026. Wristbands, etc., are sent to scout groups within the Danish Scouts (The Danish Scout Corps, YMCA Scouts, Green Girl Guides of Denmark, Danish Baptist Guide and Scout Association, and the Danish Scouts of Southern Schleswig) based within the Kingdom of Denmark and the EU (e.g., The Danish Scouts in Brussels).

Materials will be sent to the shipping address the group provided at registration. We encourage you to check your address information before May 1st, 2026.

All other international participants and all volunteers must collect wristbands and other items from the information tents upon arrival at the jamboree. More information on this will follow in Information package 4.



Jamboree Badges

At Jamboree Denmark 2026, you can obtain a complete jamboree badge, made up of three elements.

The jamboree badge, given to all participating guides and scouts, is placed in the middle and features the jamboree's logo.

The activity badge is positioned above the jamboree badge. This badge symbolises the community spirit found when engaging in activities with fellow guides and scouts. It's the umbrella under which all guides, scouts and the jamboree unite. After participating in several activities and collecting unique stickers, they can be traded for an activity badge at the jamboree's information tents.

The Friendship Award Badge is positioned below the jamboree badge. The Friendship Award Badge represents cultural exchanges and the core international guide and scout network that the guide and scout movement in Denmark is built upon. The badge journey begins and concludes at the International Hub on Lejrtorvet (the jamboree main square). Throughout the experience, guides and scouts engage in activities and complete tasks focusing on forming friendships and building community across cultures and nationalities.



Guidelines for Interaction

A set of guidelines has been established for Jamboree Denmark 2026. It applies to everyone involved, whether you are a participant, volunteer or visitor at the jamboree. The goal of this policy is to ensure a safe, inclusive, and respectful community where children, young people, and adults can flourish.

As adults and leaders within the community, we have a special duty to spearhead the creation of a positive and secure environment for everyone. We urge all adults and leaders to familiarise themselves with the policy before arriving at the jamboree. The full version of the policy includes a code of conduct, a digital policy, an alcohol policy, and a tobacco and nicotine policy. Listening Ears

At Jamboree Denmark, you will encounter the Listening Ears, who roam the jamboree both day and night. Their aim is to provide a safe atmosphere where both children and adults always have someone to approach if they feel uncertain.

Jamboree song

This year's jamboree song is called "Nu summer alting af liv" (Now Everything is Buzzing with Life) and is written by Frederik Brinth Christiansen and Marie Louise Hahne. The lyrics are based on the jamboree's theme "Connect and include" and the words "hope" and "action".

The song is about everything that happens within the community and what a community can offer each of us. It's about standing together, being curious about one another and the world we live in, and supporting each other when times are tough. By doing this, we create a space for both you and me, a place where we can grow, and a place where dreams can become reality.

Additionally, the lyrics focus on everything we create together when we meet at Hedeland this summer - a city of tents and campfires, a place where anything can happen, a scouting and guiding community where we meet new and old friends and that unique atmosphere around the campfire. Frederik and Marie encapsulate all of this in the word "scout magic"!

The melody is inspired by both guiding and scouting songs and the Danish folk songbook. The aim was to create a song that everyone can join in and hum.

During the songwriting process, Marie and Frederik gathered input from various sources - from the jamboree's guiding and scouting ambassadors, the jamboree's political strategy, and volunteers from different areas and committees at Jamboree Denmark 2026.

A little about the songwriters

Frederik Brinth and Marie Hahne are both connected to the guide and scout movements. Marie is still an active guide while Frederik has passed the scouting legacy to his children. Additionally, they are both musicians and share a passion for communal singing.

Jamboree hymn: Aldrig alene

Kim Kaas-Claesson Baasch has composed this year's jamboree hymn, entitled "Aldrig alene" (Never Alone).

The hymn speaks of the Guiding and Scouting spirit, community, being seen – and how we are all stronger when there is a square for all of us.

The hymn draws on the message of the story of Zacchaeus rather than the religious elements of the tale. There is a space for listeners to add their own words and meanings between the lines, in a way that suits their own perspective. In this way, the hymn is both interdenominational and inclusive.

The story of Zacchaeus is about a man who was excluded from the community until he was seen with fresh eyes, given a chance, and became part of the community once more. It is a story about being recognised as a person first, about the courage to step forward and about what it means when a community opens up and makes room. This is precisely what we aim to celebrate and strengthen at the jamboree.

The hymn comes in two versions: a lowbeat and an upbeat version, making it suitable for both calm and energetic moments. The song can be streamed at <https://spejderneslejr.dk/en/scout-leader/song>.

Reflection and Spirituality

Gathering

Here the jamboree comes together across different points, finds peace, and feels a sense of belonging. The aim of the Gathering is to create an open space for cooperation between guide and scout organizations, where everyone can take part, and we can collectively discover what the Gathering means for each individual and our community.

Peace, reflection, faith, meeting others and the hymn are different expressions of the same idea: We make square for each other, meet openly, and take time to feel and share the thoughts that make us stronger guides and scouts and individuals.

The Gathering Area at Aktivitetstorv Øst becomes the heart of reflection and those moments where you can truly feel the scout spirit. Here we focus on what unites us through the community we all belong to, regardless of scarf colour, faith or background.

In the Gathering Area, you will find, among other things:

The Gathering Point, located in the centre of the area, is a large tent filled with calm, presence and square for both big and small conversations. It's a free space inviting reflection and tranquillity, where the scout spirit can unfold in new ways. Guides and scouts can take a break here. There will also be inspiring presentations and small talks along the way.

The Mosque: Hosted by the Semerkand guides and scouts, the jamboree's mosque welcomes everyone to visit, ask questions, participate in prayers or simply satisfy their curiosity. Daily prayers and the Friday prayer are held here.

The Church: The goal here is for guides and scouts to explore Christianity's stories and values in various forms, sometimes quietly, other times through play, creativity, communal singing and cosy time together. Guides and scouts can look forward to a mixture of drop-in and pre-booked activities, including the church's escape room filled with ancient prophecies, star maps and mysterious clues. There will also be pop-up activities, a beatbox religious service, Taizé, morning devotions, evening communion and much more. There are activities and experiences suitable for all ages.

The main **camp religious service** will be held on Sunday July 19th at 1:00 p.m.



Reflection and Spirituality

The Hour of Reflection

The Hour of Reflection is scheduled for Wednesday evening at 7 pm. Here, the entire jamboree steps back from the hustle and bustle, providing space to reflect, converse, and cultivate spirituality.

The Hour of Reflection offers a calm evening activity period, akin to a cultural night in first gear at the jamboree. During The Hour of Reflection, you can engage in various events focused on slowing down and finding peace, allowing thoughtfulness and reflection to emerge. It's a small sanctuary within the jamboree, where the first days' impressions can settle, making space for new experiences during the rest of the jamboree.

Some activities available during other activity periods will be adapted for The Hour of Reflection, taking place at a slower pace with emphasis on reflection. Exclusive activities will also be planned for The Hour of Reflection, not available at other times. A more detailed programme for The Hour of Reflection will be released closer to the jamboree.

Activities are primarily designed for ages 8-17, but also cater to adults and children under 8. Children under 8 are recommended to be accompanied by an adult.

Time for Reflection. During The Hour of Reflection, participants can ponder their values, habits, and way of life. Activities are aligned to inspire contemplation, leaving you with food for thought.

Room to Connect. Jamboree Denmark 2026 brings together many cultures and traditions, making it an ideal venue for reflecting on your own perspectives. A primary focus of The Hour of Reflection is therefore to provide a square where differences can meet, so that one may gain deeper insight into oneself and one another. In some activities, it's the dialogue that takes centre stage.

An opportunity to **nurture spirituality**. Whether you carry your faith with you, have left it at home, or have none at all, The Hour of Reflection offers a square for spirituality to be discussed, explored, and potentially developed. At the very least, it's fascinating to learn about others' perspectives on spirituality.



Activities

Activity Sections

The jamboree's large **activity sections** are named after the points of the compass.

The compulsory subcamp days for the Forest and the Sea will take place at **Activity Square North**. There is also a stage where shows will be held for everyone throughout the week.

Activity Square South is situated in Hedeland's gravel pit, hosting the larger, wilder and space-demanding activities. You can also visit the landmark from Jamboree Denmark 2022 here.

Activity Square East is located adjacent to Lejrtorvet (the jamboree main square). Here, guides and scouts will learn about international guiding and scouting, spirituality and sustainability, among other topics. The subcamp days for Country and City will also be held here. There will also be a stage with shows open to all participants.

Activity Square West is a large and lively section, brimming with educational and fun activities where guides and scouts can easily spend a full day. Here, you'll also find a packed lunch area with cafes, food trucks, and the chance to chill your lunch boxes and fill your water bottles.

The Scout Meeting can be found at **Flintesø** (more information about this is in Information package 2).

Scenen (the arena) is located at the base of Hedeland's ski slope, where, alongside the two large campfires, other major jamboree events will be hosted.

Outside the jamboree, several activity areas can also be found, including in Roskilde, Høje-Taastrup, Veddelev Harbour, Roskilde University and at the Future Scout Hut on the outskirts of Hedeland.



Activities

The **Activity Catalogue** will be released in spring, detailing all the free and registration activities available in the activity sections. You'll find activities suited for all age groups.

Following this, **activity registration** will open for registration activities. The system is initially expected to be live for about 14 days so you can create a wish list. This gives guide and scout leaders time to discuss with the guides and scouts what they would like to include on their wish list. The system will then temporarily close while places are allocated according to the wish lists. Afterwards, the system will reopen and any remaining spots can be booked. Available activities can be booked throughout the entire jamboree.

The aim of this method is to ensure as fair a distribution of activities as possible and to allow guide and scout leaders to involve the guides and scouts without all the most popular activities being fully booked in the meantime.

Further information will follow when the activity catalogue is released and registration opens.

Activity buses transport participants to activity areas located outside the jamboree. Departures will be from a central stop at subcamp Havet (the sea). A bus ticket with route and time is automatically included upon registration for an activity outside the jamboree.

In Roskilde, for example, you can meet Vikings or spend the night in The Cathedral. From Veddelev harbour, guides and scouts can experience sailing on Roskilde Fjord. FabLab is among other things located at Roskilde University. In Høje Taastrup, guides and scouts can learn more about sustainable food. In the Future Scout Hut, the focus is on scouting life in the past, present, and future.



Activities

International Hub

The word "hub" means gathering point. International Hub is the focal point for all activities highlighting international guiding and scouting and guides and scouts as a global movement.

International Tent and International Activity Area are located respectively at Lejrstorvet (the jamboree main square) and Activity Area East. Here, guides and scouts can be inspired to learn about opportunities to travel and explore the world with their rucksacks, or take part in various international activities. There will be opportunities to seek inspiration and practical knowledge, whether using international materials at home in your group or planning a trip with your group or clan. Perhaps a scout dreams of making an organisational difference in WAGGGS (World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts) or WOSM (World Organisation of the Scout Movement). There's information available for this, or perhaps the dream will spark after visiting the International Hub.

In the **International Café**, scouts can meet new friends and sample delicacies from near and far.

The **Friendship Award badge** is achieved by participating in activities and completing tasks with their patrols. All tasks focus on building friendships and understanding across cultures and nationalities. The badge can be earned throughout the jamboree and doesn't need to be completed in one day. Further information will follow later.

Thursday is **International Day**, with a special focus on international guiding and scouting. A major international joint activity will be available in each subcamp. Subcamp Byen (the city) will experience the international joint activity on Tuesday, as they have a subcamp day on Thursday.

International Day concludes on Thursday evening with **International Campfire**, where the international Guiding and Scouting spirit truly comes alive. The target group is troop guides and scouts and older, but everyone is welcome as long as you're aware that it will be conducted in English.

Sustainability

How You Can Make a Difference for Sustainability in the Scouting World

Leading up to Jamboree Denmark 2026, there are plenty of opportunities to initiate small changes that steer your group positively towards sustainability. Dare to try something new? Find tips and tricks here for small initiatives you can try within your scout group to move the scouting world towards a more sustainable future.

Tip 1 – Get Your Camping Gear Ready for Jamboree Denmark 2026

Before the jamboree, patrol boxes usually need checking. We suggest using a scout meeting to work on the tasks needed to get the patrol box in perfect condition. For example, you can: Clean the patrol box and the camping gear in it Add new cleaning supplies Repair what's broken and sharpen the knives so they're ready for the jamboree Visit the local charity shop if something is missing from the patrol box. Charity shops often have great items at good prices that still have plenty of life left!

Tip 2 – Use Recycled Rope Instead of Sisal

Recycled rope can make pioneering more sustainable. The ropes can be untied after use and reused for new pioneering projects. Only use sisal for projects where it's necessary.

Tip 3 – Arrive at the Jamboree in an Alternative Way

Distances vary for groups travelling to Hedeland Naturpark, the venue for Jamboree Denmark 2026. Some need to take the bus, while others could make the journey a hike or bike ride. If you plan to walk or cycle to the jamboree, the Sustainability Committee would love to hear from you at BAER@sl2026.dk.

Bonus Tip – Brainstorm

Often, there are already plenty of good ideas within the group. Host an evening meeting to brainstorm small sustainable changes your guides and scouts group can make to leave the world a little better than you found it. Example: Test the recipes in the cookbook and use them on the next weekend trip with the group.

Fact Box

Did you know that Hedeland Naturpark is home to rare and protected butterfly species? This is why the jamboree is built around these areas, allowing the butterflies to enjoy the summer while we visit their habitat.

COOkbook

We've ensured there's something for everyone with a choice of two dishes every day (except the last day), along with diverse recipes and videos for each dish.

Transport

Shared Transport

All participants and volunteers at the jamboree are offered shared transport. We recommend that as many as possible make use of this offer. This optimises the buses' capacity, helping to reduce environmental impact. Additionally, it eases traffic pressure on major arrival and departure days, simplifying logistics. The shared transport, mainly by bus, is included in the participation fee for those aged 6 and up.

Entry Points for International Participants

International participants can use shared transport as soon as they arrive on Danish soil. In the registration system, you can choose the entry point you wish to use. You are free to choose from the entry points available in the registration system. The entry point must be chosen by 1st of May 2026, after which it cannot be changed. Itineraries will be available by the 1st of June 2026.

We currently have the following collection points available for foreign groups upon arrival in Denmark: Hirtshals, Frederikshavn, Billund, Flensborg (DE), Padborg, Rødby, Gedser, Kastrup, Helsingør, Oslo Ferry (Copenhagen), Øresund Bridge, Hamburg (DE) and Køge.

Some groups will be travelling by train to the jamboree

As there is extensive track work planned on Funen and West Zealand on the arrival day the 18th of July, danish bus companies will need to allocate many buses for rail replacement buses. This means we cannot secure the number of buses needed for Jamboree Denmark 2026. On the 18th of July, groups and volunteers in and around Greater Copenhagen must use the S-train or regional train to either Køge Nord, Ballerup or Høje Tåstrup station. From there, a bus will take you to the jamboree. The bus departure time will be announced by the 1st of June. Affected groups and volunteers must purchase their train tickets, but they will receive a refund in the settlement for Jamboree Denmark 2026. On return days, transport will be provided by bus for all groups.

Transportation reimbursement

If, as a group, individual participant or international service team volunteer, you do not wish to use the jamboree's shared transport, a reimbursement will be given, based on the distance from your entry point to the jamboree. On the website, you can find the refund per single journey.

Transport and Access to the Campsite

Transport of the Group's Camping Gear

The groups are responsible for transporting their own camping gear to and from the jamboree. Shared transport only includes personal camping gear.

Space is allocated in parking area P3 for parking trailers, containers, and other transport equipment during the jamboree. Groups must arrange their own transport of these to and from the campsite.

Camping gear sent to the jamboree by truck/container/pallet cages will be located in an area close to the subcamp square.

Remember to specify your storage needs for trailers, containers, etc., in your group's registration.

Access to the Campsite

Arrival is allowed no earlier than Wednesday, July 15th. Vehicles must have left the campsite by Friday, July 17th at 10:00 p.m.

Only toilets at the subcamp squares will be open. The canteen and cafe in subcamp Skoven (the forest) are open, offering food and drinks.

From Wednesday, ordered poles can also be delivered by agreement with the subcamps.

On departure day, Sunday July 26th, vehicles can enter the campsite after 4:00 p.m. or when emergency services permit.

Regulations at the Group's Campsite

Wet Pits

Jamboree Denmark 2026 will be held in two main sections:

Hedeland Nature Park is a section that was previously used for gravel extraction. This means that the water now seeping down is not as well filtered before reaching the groundwater.

The area east of Reerslev has revealed many archaeological finds from the Middle Ages. Hence, the local museum is keen to minimise any excavation in this section to preserve archaeological remains from ancient houses and settlements.

It is therefore forbidden to dig wet pits. Instead, holding tanks will be used at all toilet areas in the subcamps. We recommend groups acquire transport barrels with lids for wastewater.

Electricity at the Campsites

Electricity can only be ordered at the campsites for medical equipment. This ordering takes place through group registration. Electrical connections will be run as far as the municipal boundary. The location is arranged directly between the subcamp technology team and the municipal coordinator. Users are responsible for installing approved cables in their own sections.

Gas at the Campsites

Gas can be used and stored at the campsites. Each appliance may have one gas cylinder of up to 11 kg, plus an additional spare of the same size. Gas is available at the jamboree's hardware store on Spejdertorvet.

Firewood

Included in the participant fee, you'll find softwood firewood in three-metre lengths available for free, which the group will need to saw and split themselves. The group can purchase split hardwood firewood for delivery to Jamboree Denmark. Orders are placed at the time of the group's registration.

Groups are encouraged to be creative and think of firewood-saving solutions such as an elevated fireplace or a homemade wood burning stove.

Are your group ready to try an energy-efficient way of cooking a meal?

Try making a Mini Rocket Stove during a scout meeting. You can cook small meals over this energy-friendly fire source.

Regulations at the Group's Campsite

Rules for putting up firefighting equipment on the group's campsite

A fire bucket of at least 10 litres must be placed at each sleeping tent. The bucket must be filled with water. If several tents are set up in a cluster (up to eight tents), the number of fire buckets can be reduced. However, there must be at least three fire buckets per tent cluster.

A fire bucket of at least 10 litres must be placed at each campfire site. The bucket must be full of water.

A manual water pump or pressurised water extinguisher (minimum nine kg) must be present at the campsite. If a manual pump is used, the water tank must be full. If replaced with a large garden sprayer, this must be clearly marked as "Fire Equipment" and supplemented with a filled water can or fire bucket, ensuring at least 10 litres of water are available.

In addition, there must be at least one fire beater (remember to teach guides and scouts to use these correctly).

Firefighting equipment must be placed somewhere visible and easily accessible.

Powder extinguishers are not allowed on the jamboree.

Rules for Setting Up Tents, Campfire Sites, etc. The group's campsite rules will be in Information package 4, which also includes the allocation of campsite areas.

Wooden Pole Structures

Lashings on raft structures must be executed according to good Scout practice. For structures at risk of toppling over in gale-force winds (13.9 m/s and above), the load-bearing rafters must be buried or attached to strong stakes anchored in the ground.

In strong winds, any covers for dining tables and similar setups must be secured or taken down.

Approval by the Authorities

As mentioned in Information package 2, larger raft constructions must be approved by the authorities through the jamboree's emergency services.

The deadline for submitting the application has been extended to March 31th 2026.

The application is prepared by completing a concept description, including a risk assessment. Drawings and any calculations must be attached. You can find guidance for this on our website.

Concept Description

In a concept description, you, as organisers, can outline your structure and explain what you intend to create. If you plan to construct a structure, you must also attach drawings of its design.

Risk Assessment

In a risk assessment, you evaluate what risks your structure poses to participants. For example, assess the risk of collapse and detail measures to minimise these risks, such as regular inspections.

Please note that larger structures, especially those involving overnight stays at height, might require engineering calculations, with the costs to be covered by your group.

Tents and One-pole Marquees

Tents, such as one-pole marquees larger than 100 m² or with sides covering more than half the circumference, must also be registered with the jamboree's emergency services by March 31th at beredskab@sl2026.dk.

After submitting your application, our dedicated IST Support Team will help match you with a position within the Jamboree organization.

As an IST you make a difference and if you contribute with at least 40 hours before, during or after the jamboree as an IST your participation fee will be reduced with 30%.
