



Introduction to our Privacy Policy

This Privacy Policy applies to the information you provide when you or your child register for events organised by Foreningen Spejderne (e.g., Spejdernes Lejr 2026), when you volunteer with us, act as a partner or supplier, or when you visit our websites www.spejderne.dk, www.spejderneslejr.dk or our social media channels.

The policy explains what information we collect, how we process it and how long we retain it, among other things. If there is anything in the policy that you cannot accept, please contact kontakt@spejderne.dk.

We regularly review the policy to ensure it remains up-to-date and in accordance with applicable principles and legislation. The policy may be changed without notice; significant updates will be published on our website, together with the updated version of the policy.

This policy was last updated on 18 August 2025.

Processing of your personal data is governed by the EU General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) and the Danish Data Protection Act.

How old are you?

If you are under 13, your parents/guardians must assist you in registering for an event and reading the terms and conditions of your participation with you, as we want to ensure that you understand what you're agreeing to and may be paying for.

We reserve the right to inquire about age if there is any doubt regarding the validity of consent given.

Purpose of Processing Your Personal Data

Depending on whether you are a participant at an event, a relative of a participant, a volunteer or simply a user of our websites, we are obliged to process your personal data to provide the services you request and



to fulfil our obligations as Foreningen Spejderne. This is especially important when we need to manage your or your child's registration for an event.

In cases where you are required to provide us with information about yourself or your child, this will be indicated at the point where we collect the data, marked with *. If you choose not to provide the personal information we request, it may mean that you or your child cannot participate in the event or that you cannot take part in our work as a volunteer.

The Personal Data We Process About You

We may collect and process the following general, confidential and sensitive personal information about you:

- As a **participant at events** with us:

Name, address, postcode, city, country, mobile number, email address, date of birth, contact details for relatives, registration and account number, health information, scout group affiliation and photos.

- As a **relative of a participant at events run by us:**

Name, address, postcode, city, country, mobile number, email address and possibly registration and account number.

- As **the contact person for a scout group participating in our events, we may process** the following:

name, address, postcode, town/city, mobile number, email address, registration and account numbers, group affiliation, and photographs.

- As a **volunteer** with us:

Name, address, postcode, city, mobile number, email address, date of birth, health information, photos, role as a volunteer (e.g. kitchen assistant), registration and account number, CPR number for obtaining a criminal records disclosure certificate and contact details for relatives.

- As **the contact person for authorities, suppliers and partners:**

Name, position, company, CVR number, address, postcode, city, mobile number, email address, payment details, if applicable. CPR number.

- As a **visitor to our website:**



We use cookies on our websites to enhance the user experience, for example, through user statistics. [Here you can read about our use of cookies](#). Cookies are used by virtually all websites. In some cases, cookies are the only way to ensure a website functions as intended.

A cookie is a file placed on your computer or other IT equipment. It enables us to recognise your computer and collect information about which pages and features you access with your browser. However, cookies cannot reveal who you are, what your name is, where you live, or whether the computer is used by one or more people. They also cannot spread computer viruses or other harmful programmes. You will be notified via the information desk before we set cookies.

On spejderne.dk, cookies are used in connection with the following:

- Statistics collection (Google Analytics)
- When embedding content from third parties (e.g. YouTube, Microsoft Forms, Google Maps)

You can always refuse cookies on your computer by changing your browser settings. The location of the settings depends on the browser you are using. However, please be aware that doing so may prevent you from using many functions and services on the Internet.

All browsers allow you to delete your cookies collectively or individually. How you do this depends on the browser you are using. Remember, if you use multiple browsers, you need to delete cookies in each one.

What is my information used for?

How your information is used depends on whether you are a participant in an event, a relative of a participant, a volunteer with us, a partner, or simply a user of our website.

If you are a **participant at an event** with us, we use your personal information to:

- manage your registration and participation, including:
- send you the necessary information regarding your participation via the information desk
- process any payments if applicable
- assist you with matters relating to your participation
- invite you to other scouting events
- assist you with any health-related matters, including considerations for allergens, during your participation in our events
- Furthermore, photographs of you may be taken and used in communications about scouting within the movement.

If you are a **relative of a participant at our events**, we use your personal information to:

- collect payment if your child is not responsible for it
- send you the necessary information regarding your child's participation via the information desk
- contact you in the event of an accident or any other matter concerning your child
- assist you in managing your child's participation



If you are the **contact person for a scout group**, we use your personal information to:

- manage your and your group's registration and participation, including:
- send you the necessary information regarding your participation and that of your group via the information desk
- process any payments if applicable
- assist you with matters relating to your participation and that of your group

If you are a **volunteer** with us, we use your personal information to:

- manage your registration as a volunteer in the same way as if you were a participant at an event, as mentioned above, and also to:
- contact you regarding the coordination of tasks and events
- obtain a criminal records disclosure certificate for you if you have regular contact with children under the age of 15
- facilitate contact between you and the scouts, family members and other volunteers on projects under Foreningen Spejderne.
- reimburse any expenses you incur in connection with your contribution to us

If you are a contact person for authorities, suppliers and partners, we use your personal information to:

- enter into and fulfil agreements
- manage contractual relationships, including financial dealings

If you are the sole **user of our website**, we use your personal information to:

- make features available to you on our website
- compile statistics about your activities on our website
- optimise the design of our website

Why are we permitted to process information about you?

General personal data

- If you take part in an event as a participant, are a relative, a volunteer or a partner, we need to process your basic personal data so that we can make an agreement with you or your child or deal with any enquiries before entering into an agreement with us. We are legally required to retain accounting information for up to five years due to the Danish Accounting Act. Five years after your or your child's participation, the information retained for accounting purposes will be deleted.

- Images are stored at <https://spejderne.imageshop.no//1438285> and are used on www.spejderne.dk, www.spejderneslejr.dk, social media and in publications for Foreningen Spejderne to illustrate what we do, for PR and in publications. Images are used only in accordance with scouting values.



We reserve the right to publish photos taken in a scouting context for communication about the scout movement in printed, digital and social media, including Facebook.

We share both portrait photos and images where the primary purpose is to show a situation, for example, guides or scouts taking part in an activity. Therefore, we cannot rule out that a scout/guide or your child may be recognisable in some of our photos, but the intention is to showcase what the scouts do.

We only share images that do not contain sensitive personal data and are considered harmless and unlikely to offend anyone.

If you do not want images of you or your child to be shared, you can withdraw your consent at any time by contacting kontakt@spejderne.dk. We will then not take or share any new photos of you or your child.

If you see a photo of yourself or your child that you do not want to be publicly available, you can request its deletion by contacting kontakt@spejderne.dk. Images are deleted on an ongoing basis as the purpose for which they were collected is fulfilled.

- We have an interest in being able to send you emails with information concerning your participation in events or your volunteer activities. Should you no longer wish to receive emails from us, you can opt out by contacting kontakt@spejderne.dk.

(Legal basis for processing: Article 6(1)(b) and (c) of the GDPR). 1 (f))

- We compile various statistics regarding website usage. If you use our website, we need, to a limited extent, to process the information you provide, for example, for cookie management. For further details, please refer to our cookie policy. In some instances, we may record the IP addresses that have visited our website. Data collected for statistical purposes will be deleted no later than two years after collection.

(Legal basis for processing: Article 6(1)(b) and (c) of the GDPR). 1 (f))

Sensitive personal data

- As a participant in an event with us, we may ask about health information to better accommodate your participation. Providing information about your health is entirely optional. We ensure at all times that access to the information is limited to relevant individuals. If you no longer wish us to have access to your information, you may withdraw your consent to its processing at any time by contacting us at kontakt@spejderne.dk.

Health information provided in connection with participation in an event will be deleted no later than four months after the event's end date.

(Legal basis for processing: Article 9, section 2(a) of the General Data Protection Regulation) 2 (a))



Confidential personal information

- If we ask for your personal information when applying for a criminal records disclosure certificate, it is because, under the Executive Order on criminal records disclosure certificates, we are required to obtain these certificates for people who have regular contact with children under the age of 15. Once acquired, only the date of the request is retained. The certificate itself is destroyed immediately.

(Legal basis for processing: Article 6(1)(b) and (c) of the GDPR). 1 (c))

- If we request your CPR number for the payment of a fee, it is used for reporting to SKAT (the Danish tax authority). Accounting information is retained for up to five years in accordance with the Danish Accounting Act.

(Legal basis for processing: Article 6(1)(b) and (c) of the GDPR). 1 (b) and para. 1 (c))

Who do we share your personal information with?

We may share your personal information with suppliers and partners who assist us with, for example, finances, IT operations and hosting. This means that we might share your information with our service providers, technical support and our bank.

At Foreningen Spejderne, our processing of your or your child's personal data is subject to internal policies and procedures that ensure an appropriate level of security from the time the data is collected until it is deleted. Furthermore, we only entrust our data processing to data processors who maintain an equivalent level of security.

Sharing Your Information with Recipients Outside the EU/EEA

In certain cases, we transfer your personal data to recipients outside the EU/EEA. This occurs when we utilise service providers in countries outside the EU. Such transfers will be made in accordance with the General Data Protection Regulation, for example by using the European Commission's standard contractual clauses or the EU–US Data Privacy Framework. You may contact us at kontakt@spejderne.dk if you would like information on how to obtain a copy of the relevant legal basis for the transfer, or where this legal basis has been made available.

What rights do i have?

As the individual providing personal data, you hold a number of rights that you can exercise by reaching out to kontakt@spejderne.dk.



Please be aware that there may be conditions or limitations attached to exercising these rights. Therefore, you may not, for example, have the right to erasure in a specific case—it depends on the particular circumstances of the processing activity.

Access

You have the right to access the personal data that we process about you. By writing to us at kontakt@spejderne.dk, you can request access to the personal information we hold about you, including the purposes for which it was collected. We will comply with your access request as swiftly as possible. If we have any doubts regarding your identity, we may ask you to provide further identification.

Rectification and Erasure

You have the right to request the rectification, supplementation, erasure or restriction of the personal data we process about you. We will fulfil your request as quickly as possible, to the extent necessary. If, for any valid reason, we cannot accommodate your request, we will contact you.

Restriction of Processing

You have, in certain circumstances, the right to have the processing of your personal data restricted.

Data Portability

You have the right to receive your personal data (only information about yourself that you have provided to us) in a structured, commonly used and machine-readable format.

Right to Object

In certain instances, you have the right to request that we do not process your personal data. This applies where the processing is based on Article 6(1)(f) of the General Data Protection Regulation. 1 (f)).

Withdrawal of Consent

If the processing of your personal data is based on your consent, you have the right to withdraw your consent at any time. Your withdrawal does not affect the lawfulness of processing carried out before you withdrew your consent, and so the change applies only going forward.

How Can I Complain About Your Processing of My Personal Data?

If you are dissatisfied with our handling of your or your child's personal data and wish to complain, we would be pleased to be informed and will do our best to address your concerns, although you are always entitled to complain directly to the Danish Data Protection Authority:
